When she first started working at Pilot Dogs, it was cleaning the kennel. She was just getting started in the Apprentice Trainer Program when the job became too demanding with a newborn at home and a husband that needed to travel for work.

Several years later, Pilot Dogs reached out to Dawn to see if she was interested in filling

the position of Kennel Manager. Dawn said yes and has been the Kennel Manager for the last 18 years.

Her favorite things about working at Pilot Dogs are, of course, the different dog breeds and their personalities. Dawn first became familiar with the Doberman Pinscher breed by working here and now it is her favorite breed. Dawn loves witnessing the changes the dogs go through, throughout their training. Dawn really enjoys the medical side of her job. With the

new veterinarian clinic, she is able to see all kinds of procedures and learns something new almost everyday. Plus, having a veterinarian on staff makes her job a lot less stressful.

Over the years, Dawn has opened her home to several of our older retired dogs and dogs with medical issues. At one point in time, she had seven retired and/or career


PUPPY OUTING TO PRIORITY DESIGNS

Earlier this year, we had two large litters of puppies born around the same time and were in desperate need of puppy raisers. Priority Designs contacted us to let us know that a few employees might be interested in raising for us. Priority Designs, a longtime supporter of Pilot Dogs, helped us design and build Tobi, our blow up mascot. So, we packed up two puppies to head out and give a talk about our Volunteer Puppy Raising program. We were optimistic, but if we didn't get someone to sign up to raise a puppy, it would at least be a good socialization opportunity.

While we talked to the employees, the Labrador and the Golden Retriever enjoyed scratches from everyone. Since the office designs all kinds of things, there were many large, strange looking objects, and the puppies were not even phased.

It was the Lab puppy's lucky day! One of the employees decided to take her home that afternoon and raise her. His wife and child were very excited and signed up for our Obedience class. A couple weeks later, another employee took home one of our poodle puppies!

We are always in need of Puppy Raisers, that will keep a puppy in their home, from 9-10 weeks old until they are about 12-14 months. We have a veterinarian on staff and offer obedience lessons at our facility. If you are unable to use our facilities, we do cover vet costs and a stipend for an approved obedience course.
